For the first time, the event expanded across two buildings, creating additional space for valuable content, networking opportunities, and a more seamless attendee journey starting at registration. Delegate attendance grew to an impressive 10,500, reflecting increased participation from core groups such as government officials, mining executives, investors, and exhibitors.

This year's theme, "Future-proofing African mining, today," sparked essential industry discussions and encouraged long-term collaboration. Notably, government representation reached unprecedented levels. Ministers shaping the mining sector, as well as those influencing finance, trade, and logistics, actively contributed to key conversations.

CEO Keynote Addresses Were Stronger Than Ever

Mining Indaba 2025's C-Suite CEOs and executives from leading African-focused mining companies delivered impactful addresses to delegates. Their presence and contributions were among the key highlights of the event.

Their profiles extended across the event, starting at exploration level, including the Explorers' Showcase, to junior miners, particularly prominent at Dealmakers Den, through to mid-tier and major companies. This wide-ranging focus and diverse standing were evident throughout the week.

Africa's most powerful CEOs and executives, overseeing some of Africa's largest mining operation owners including Anglo American, Glencore, Rio Tinto, Barrick Gold, Harmony Gold, ERG Resources, B2Gold, CMOC,



South32, De Beers, Seriti Resources, Anglo American Platinum, Kumba Iron Ore, Exxaro, KoBold Metals, Ivanhoe Mines, to name a few, delivered powerful messages showcasing their commitment to future-proofing the industry.

They were joined at CEO level by some of the industry's supporting and parallel sectors that collectively help shape the sector – including Eskom, Transnet, the ICMC, Minerals Council South Africa, MASA, and various high-profile consulting firms.

Connecting these high-powered executives with a high-profile array of global investors and mining ministers, ensured Mining Indaba delivered on its core commitment – enhancing dealmaking opportunities for the industry.



Building a Unified African Mining Value Chain

With 58 ministers and 1400+ government officials in attendance, representing 32 mineral-producing African countries, Mining Indaba 2025 was not just a conversation, but a crucial turning point that marked a renewed commitment to developing a unified and sustainable mining value chain across the continent.

Breaking barriers, unlocking potential

Beginning with the Ministerial Symposium on Sunday 2 February, governments led the charge at Mining Indaba 2025. The symposium addressed longstanding challenges such as regulatory hurdles and fragmented strategies, focusing on actionable solutions. A significant outcome was the commitment from governments to

work collaboratively to streamline permitting processes and strengthen resource stewardship. Discussions emphasized the need for advancing opportunities for downstream value addition, shifting the continent's mining model from raw export to local beneficiation, a move that is critical for energy security, industrial growth, and long-term prosperity; ensuring that the continent's mineral wealth benefits African economies first and foremost.

Global demand, African leadership

With the surge in global demand for critical minerals growing, African leadership at the conference demonstrated the bold strides taken by governments towards harnessing the continent's full potential. By adopting best practices, leveraging technology, and strengthening collaboration between governments and industry, Africa is positioning itself as the leading player in the global mining industry.

Key highlights

At the Intergovernmental Summit, held from 3-5 February, African leaders and international partners explored how best to bring investment into local mineral processing and downstream manufacturing, providing a unique platform for dialogue between government officials, industry stakeholders and investors. On 6 February, during the dedicated Critical Minerals Day on Disruptive Discussions, the focus shifted to redefining Africa's critical minerals strategy. Government, alongside key industry stakeholders, explored not only the minerals needed for the energy transition but also those necessary for economic development and wealth creation on the continent.

A clear vision for Africa's mining future

The key takeaway from Mining Indaba 2025 was clear: Africa's time is now. The discussions and engagements led by government reaffirmed a shared vision for the continent's mining future – one that is inclusive, sustainable, and driven by African leaders and communities.

Diversity and Inclusion Brought Fresh Perspectives

Communities and indigenous people became a prominent voice

For the first time, representatives from indigenous groups and local communities actively participated at Mining Indaba, offering their perspectives on sustainable and equitable mining practices. This initiative underscored the industry's commitment to inclusivity and acknowledged the vital role these communities play in shaping mining's future.

Discussions aimed at empowering Africa's mineral endowment, artisanal mining and safety, collaborative relationships and post-mining livelihoods took centre stage.

The community voice emphasized the need for a shared vision among all stakeholders, including governments, investors, mining companies, and communities, to future-proof mining operations.

These sessions highlighted the industry's

dedication to engaging with communities, ensuring that mining activities contribute positively to local development and uphold environmental and social responsibilities.

Putting women in mining at the forefront

Mining Indaba truly embraced, supported and welcomed women in the African and globally connected mining sector. Providing a space of comfort and networking, the Women in Mining lounge enabled any woman within the venue a 'home'.

The lounge also showcased the partnership established with two leading women in mining associations – the Association of Women in Mining in Africa (AWIMA) and Women in Mining South Africa (WIMSA). Together we reiterated a commitment to amplifying women's voices in the industry. This collaboration aimed to advocate for policies and practices that promote gender equality, create supportive environments, and empower women to take on leadership roles within the mining sector.

Across the event, which showcased 40% female speaker representation, conversations highlighted the necessity of involving women in decision-making processes related to mining operations

to foster sustainable community development. Emphasis was placed on the unique perspectives women bring, which can lead to more effective community engagement and the implementation of practices that benefit local populations.

Panel discussions examined the systemic barriers that hinder women's entry and progression in the mining industry, such as limited access to education and training, cultural biases, and workplace discrimination. Strategies were proposed to dismantle these obstacles, including targeted recruitment, mentorship programs, and policy reforms aimed at creating equitable opportunities for women.

The importance of increasing women's representation in policymaking and leadership positions within the mining industry was a recurring theme. Efforts to advocate for gender-responsive policies and the inclusion of women in high-level decision-making processes were highlighted as essential steps toward achieving gender parity in the sector.

All of this reflects a concerted effort to address the multifaceted challenges and opportunities women face in the mining industry, and to implement strategies that promote inclusivity, safety, and empowerment.

Driving a Powerful Future Through the Next Generation and the End Consumer

Mining's next generation

A key deliverable supporting the Mining Indaba 2025 future-proofing theme was the inclusion of young mining professionals, not only through the popular Young Leaders programme on Thursday but through additional participation across the week.

For the first time, PhD students were featured as speakers in several sessions that included Disruptive Discussions, the Tech & Innovation Hub, Sustainability Series and Intergovernmental Summit programmes. Their participation brought fresh perspectives and innovative ideas to industry conversations.

The over-subscribed Young Leaders programme featured fireside chats with CEOs and industry leaders shared personal stories about their educational paths, early career influences, and mentorship experiences with leaders of the future.

In addition, Mining Indaba's partnership with the University of Cape Town's LEAD programme,

the Future Leaders Initiative, connected young professionals with CEOs, government officials, and industry experts. This initiative highlighted emerging talents and ensured their inclusion in critical discussions about the future of Africa's mining industry.



Downstream buyers on the rise

Downstream buyers, with a strong emphasis on the automotive and battery sectors, gained valuable perspectives on Africa's critical minerals, including copper, cobalt, lithium, nickel, graphite, and manganese – all essential for electric vehicles and renewable energy storage.

Discussions addressed global demand, sustainable sourcing, African procurement options and strategies to build resilient supply chains – all contributing towards the value this sector saw in participating in 2025.

The result saw Mining Indaba's downstream buyers more than double compared to 2024's figures.

For the first time, downstream buyers were able to connect with

key mining stakeholders, providing insights, the opportunity to forge partnerships, and engage in discussions that will effectively bring these two sectors closer together.

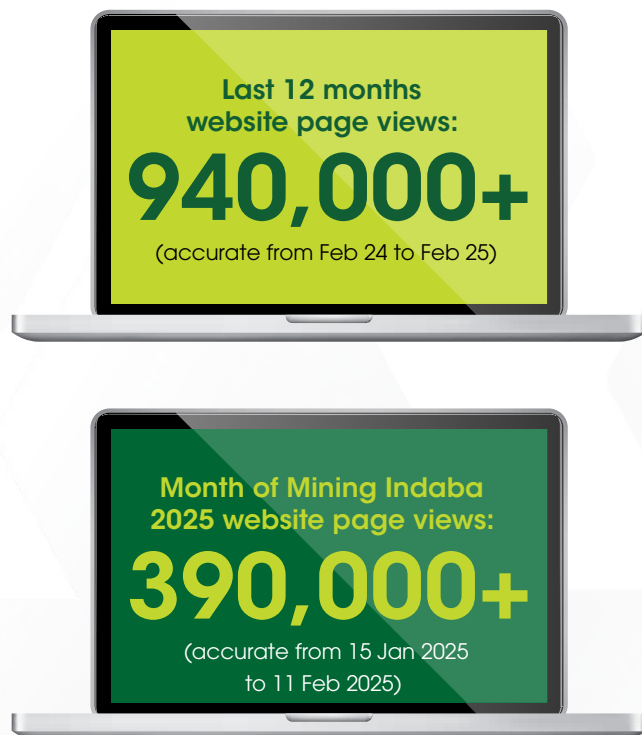

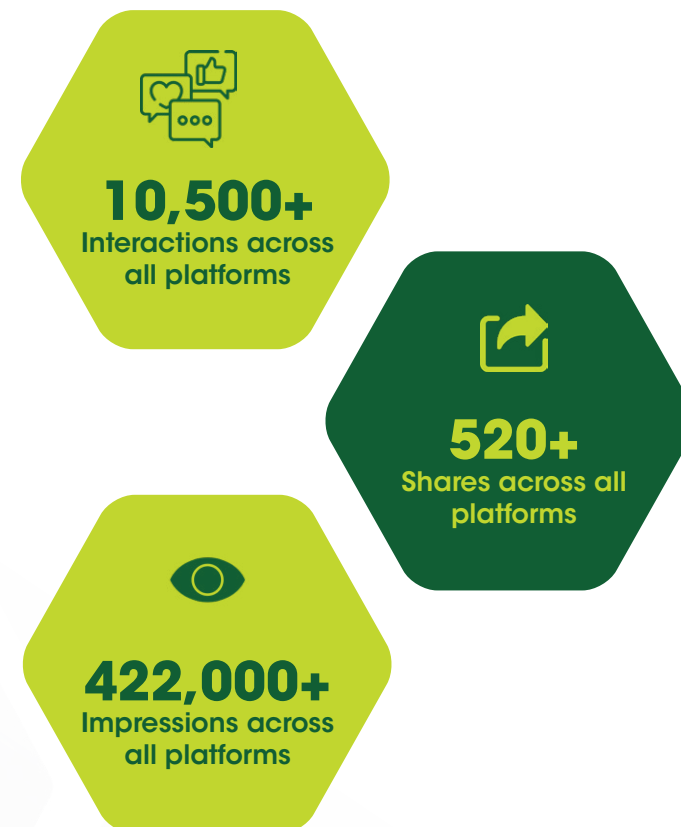
