



PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

DAY 1 OUTCOME

Chaired by Dr Albert Butare, Former Minister of State: Energy and Water & CEO of Africa Energy Services Group, Rwanda, the opening keynote session addressed the theme of East African power and energy investment. Investors gave their insights on the industry.

The strategic conference programme focused on East Africa's decentralised energy revolution, with debates on the strategic direction of renewable energy business models and securing funding and bankability of mini-grid projects.

The free to attend Knowledge Hub programme explored East Africa's dynamic hydropower industry. High level speakers brought regional case studies and practical solutions for maintaining large-scale hydropower projects. The day ended with a review of Africa's small-scale hydropower market.

DAY 2 OUTCOME

A highlight of the strategic conference was the closing session.

Matthew Matimbwi, Executive Secretary, Tanzania Renewable Energy

Association (TAREA) / Chairperson in Tanzania presented a case study and
encouraged participants to explore the challenges of mini-grid beneficiaries
accessing the electricity for productive uses.

The Knowledge Hub programme explored solutions for East Africa utilities. The sessions addressed the impact of wayleaves and land dispute for utility scale projects, revenue cycle management and reducing both technical and non-technical losses.
